## OVERVIEW

Sometimes, the needs surrounding us seem to scream out for help. Other times, an awareness comes softly, and the nudge to get involved feels as if it is from God. Saying yes to involvement in a ministry requires a long, hard look at your calendar.

Your hfe should be hived according to your vatues, and your calendar should reflect your príoríties.

- Exploring agencies and organizations actively ministering in the space you feel called to serve provides invaluable learning opportunities.
- The Bible provides us with a crucial reminder, "count the cost" and "consider if you are able" (Luke 14:28,31) before starting a new endeavor.
- Your prayers should provide His plan. What is He asking you to do? Write it down. Create a plan.
- Invite a knowledgeable friend, trusted businessperson, or a church leader to review your plan and provide feedback.
- Wait on the Lord. Consider any delays, waiting periods, or perceived setbacks as preparation time for the next thing.
